1. **Juvenile team first overall** – The Juvenile team won both their games last week and now sit atop the standings in the RSEQ Div. 1 league. On Wednesday, in their first game since the x-mas break, the team defeated College Assomption 4-2. The players were still a little rusty and missed a number of chances. One of the Assomption goals came off some miscommunication between the D and the goalie. Up 3-2 late into the third, Jeff Atrill buried a beauty goal, going top shelf on the short side to ice it. On Friday, the team travelled to Boisbriand to face Harrington College. With 5 regulars out of the line-up, Harrington was in tough. Rennie lifted their game in the second period, moving the puck quickly and attacking the net on every chance, winning the game 6-1. Will Davidson had 2 goals and 1 assist in the win.
2. **Juvenile Girls lock up first place** – The Juvenile Girls handed LCC their first loss of the season, defeating them 5-2 in LCC. This solidified their first place in the division. Coach Alex was proud of the way the girls played and once again, could count on a great performance by goalie Morgan Moffat. Katheryn Tremblay lead JRHS attack, scoring and creating numerous chances all game.
3. **Bantam team remains undefeated** - Even with a short bench of 7 forwards and 4 defense, the Bantam team kept their undefeated season intact as they won 7-1 against BHS last Thursday. A big game against rival Kuper Academy on Wednesday is just what the team needs as they will face one of the stronger teams in the league.
4. **Espoir Royals start the year with a win (by Jim Webster)** - Our Espoir team continued their winning ways with a convincing 8-4 win over les Pionniers Lanaudiere. 8 different players scored goals in an impressive offensive display. The team came out flying and raced out to a 5-0 lead, during which time they missed another 5 wide open nets from in close on nice passing plays. At one point the team seemed to lose some focus because of the big lead and let Les Pionniers slowly creep back into the game.

With the score 5-2 after the second period, a Zamboni breakdown caused an extended stay in the dressing room and further disruption to the flow of the game. A power play goal by them made things a little tense for awhile at 5-3 for a team that had dominated the first half of the game. A nice goal by Trevor Lorber on a well-executed 3 on 1 with Corey Iapalucci seemed to get the team back on track and able to control the rest of the game.

Once again the team looked strong with everybody in the lineup, except Vincent Watt who was up with the Lions. Solid play from all six defencemen gave them virtually nothing on the rush and had the

puck moving quickly and effectively up the ice the whole game. Our fast forwards put constant forchecking pressure on the puck with disciplined high man support causing many turnovers in the offensive zone.

Clear improvements were seen on the team`s Power Play, which saw much quicker and more effective puck movement and execution to provide some glorious opportunities from every location. A more consistent net presence and more ``shot-pass`` decisions from the point lead directly to 3 goals. All-in-all a good day for a team that really seems to be coming together and really having some fun out there.

Player of the game honours went to Chandler Shapiro, the team`s ``super-sub``. Assigned officially to the `farm-team' (Midget CC) at the beginning of the season to get more game action, Chandler scored his 3rd goal of the season in his 9th appearance, and added an assist in a solid performance.
